



Scholarship Award

For individuals who are interested in becoming Certified Crop Advisors, the Mid-Atlantic Certified Crop Advisor program is offering \$500 awards to one qualified individual at each of the region's land grant and agricultural colleges.

The American Society of Agronomy (ASA) established the Certified Crop Advisor program to promote technical, ethical and environmental standards in advising farmers in crop production through an initial certification process and an ongoing continuing educational process.

The award includes the cost of the exams, which will be paid for by up front by MACCA (approx. \$250 depending on which state Nutrient Management exam is taken) and the remaining cash award will be paid upon successful completion of the international and local exams. Certification will require two-years of experience in crop advising. Exams take place in February and August.
